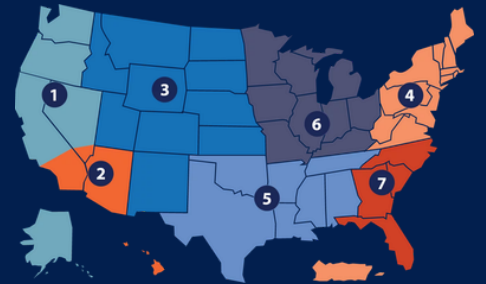

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT EVENTS

InternSHPE

InternSHPE featured members who shared their internship experiences with companies such as Meta, Steel Dynamics, and Raytheon. The event gave students insight into the internship process, workplace expectations, and the opportunity to ask questions and learn from their peers.



Resume & LinkedIn Workshops

Members supported one another by reviewing resumes, improving LinkedIn profiles, and helping each other prepare for upcoming career fairs and internship opportunities.

Info Sessions

Members shared advice for students who did not have summer internships, including project ideas, FE exam preparation, hackathons, and other ways to keep growing professionally during the summer.

COMMUNITY OUTREACH EVENTS

Science Olympiad

February, 2026

Science Olympiad is a STEM competition where students showcase engineering and science projects through a variety of events. Members volunteered as judges for the hovercraft competition while encouraging younger students to explore STEM through hands-on innovation.



Salvation Army

March, 2026

Members volunteered with the Salvation Army to help organize donated clothing and support local families in need.

The Big Event

April, 2026

Members volunteered at the Lexington Museum by helping clean and maintain aircraft displays, contributing to the preservation of local history while giving back to the community through service and teamwork.



FUNDRAISING EVENTS

Aguas Fresca Sale

Members organized and hosted aguas frescas fundraisers on campus to support chapter activities, professional development opportunities, and travel assistance for SHPE events.



MEMBERSHIP EVENTS

General Meetings

General meetings give members a space to connect, stay updated on upcoming events, and grow together through SHPE-led learning activities, discussions, and community building.



Workshops

Workshops provide hands-on learning experiences that help members develop technical and professional skills through interactive engineering projects and collaborative activities. Recently, members collaborated with ASME and IEEE to host a mini robot workshop where participants built and programmed small robots.

Study Nights

Study nights provide a space for members to study together, prepare for exams, and support one another academically. This year, we hosted a study night open to all engineering students, which had a great turnout and encouraged peer learning across majors.



Socials

Social events give members a chance to relax, have a good time, and build friendships outside the classroom. This year, members participated in a soccer social and an organization potluck, helping strengthen our community.

NATIONAL CONVENTION

SHPE National Convention is the largest gathering of Hispanics in STEM in the country, bringing together thousands of students, professionals, and corporate representatives. Members attend workshops, network with peers and employers, and connect with career opportunities through one of the largest STEM career fairs in the country.



In 2025, SHPE TAMU-CC helped 9 undergraduate and graduate students attend the National Convention through partial financial support. This experience allowed our members to grow professionally, build meaningful connections, and explore internship and full-time opportunities.



OUR GOAL

In 2026, SHPE TAMU-CC aims to increase student attendance at the National Convention and provide fully funded opportunities so financial barriers do not limit access to career-changing experiences.
